2022 BORDEAUX – THE VINTAGE AND THE WINES

Virtually every château I visited during my week in Bordeaux led with a defense against the obvious objection to 2022: "Of course by now you know that 2022 was a very hot year, with drought conditions, but...", and a big focus on the 'but'. That 'but' seems to be a very positive one however - many 2022s offer an almost perplexing, paradoxical level of freshness. The best wines of the vintage offer high-wire act level balance, combining super intensity of fruit, enticingly exoticedged fragrance, and surprisingly reasonable PH levels, and expressions of freshness. When I met with Christian Moueix in Libourne, he was unequivocal - this is a great vintage, "even greater than 1982, because of the low yield". Did the tough, dry conditions favour some terroirs over others?, I wondered. He paused, and considered my question before answering - "In theory in these conditions clay or limestone are favoured, but in practice no", he said, followed by a broad smile.

Alcohol levels are on the high side in 2022. We are talking above 14% alcohol by volume (ABV) in most cases, and there were some grands vins made in 2022 at 15%. Take a pause now and let that number sink in. Fifteen. (Where possible I have included the alcohol levels with my tasting notes). The second element in the 2022 style is that due to a lack of water, and intense heat, berries were small, and the ratio between skins (aromas, flavours, tannins) and juice was low. In other words it was easy to extract a lot from less, and easy to achieve concentration. 2022 has the potential for intense aroma and fruit, but also formidable levels of tannin. Nonetheless, many château seemed to get extractions right. The pendulum has been moving in this 'easy-does-it' direction style-wise for some years now, and I was really pleased to see elegance in wines like Pape

Clément and Angelus for instance. Others made wine with a 'classical' sort of extraction. Wines like Ducru-Beaucaillou and Léoville Las Cases seem almost brutal in their structure, and left me scratching my head a little. Both feel like they have a chance of turning out brilliantly, but it is difficult to tell beneath the sheer cloak of tannin. In any case they will require long cellaring, and this is worth noting. Indeed, Léoville Las Cases write in their primeurs booklet - 'This 2022 vintage reminds us of the 1870'. I have not tasted Las Cases 1870, but over the years I have tried 1870 Lafite, 1870 Gruaud Larose and 1870 Mouton amongst others all are still rich and structured in the 21st century! They would have been a challenge to taste from cask!! These days however, as customers, we are used to drinking windows that begin earlier. So, read references to tannin and structure in tasting notes (mine and others') carefully if this is not for you, even if the wines will amaze your great grandchildren.

In some cases these two factors - alcoholic heat exacerbated by rich tannins - dominate in the wines. There is a real feeling of intensity, density, but not the lushness of real fruit, especially midpalate, to balance. Not much fun.

But where all this was managed well, and the secret to 2022 was there – <u>freshness</u> – some real Bordeaux magic is on offer in 2022. This is not a relentlessly *ripe* and *sweet* baked vintage. There's real vivacity. Think of it more as a supercharged year.

Why in a year of heat and drought is there such freshness? I heard many different explanations, some contradictory between châteaux, but here are some key points. At Château Lafleur, Omri Ram pointed to three factors that distinguish 2022 from other hot years. Firstly, there was good rainfall in November and December 2021, ensuring some

moisture reserves for 2022. This was followed by a 'real winter', giving the vines a break. Then, when the vines woke up in the Spring, 2022 was already into drought conditions, an important signal for the vines which put energy into root systems. Leaf production was not excessive, and bunches were smaller. There were ten nights of frost in March/April, but there was little damage, there was one incident of hail (at a small part of Grand Village), but after that the vintage was quite linear, with very little disease pressure, and fruit at harvest was in very good health.

Thomas Burke, at Château Margaux echoed Ram's comments that this was a "relatively easy vintage, with no frost, no hail, no disease pressure." There was very little rain – 340mm. The heat and drought delivered incredibly small berries (the lowest weight berries in 20 years), and consequently the yields were low – 25hl/ha. The wine was dense and ripe, with lots of concentration and tannin (highest tannins level ever), but the surprise at the estate was how round and soft the tannins were. "Something unique happened – the freshness. When we look at the PH level of 2022, it's even lower than in 2021. It's a paradox." "Why?" – someone asked during our visit. Burke replied "We

don't know. Everyone has ideas why it is this way, and we love to talk about those ideas, but in truth it is probably a number of factors, but we don't know. But taste the wines and see for yourself." To my palate, Château Margaux is something close to the archetype 2022, in the best sense – it is straight and structured in a way that reminds me of their 1986, but with finer, softer tannins, even more freshness (in a more 1996 direction), and the sort of precision we have only really seen in the past decade or less.

Were there district winners and losers? I missed too many châteaux to be more definitive in answering this question. It doesn't seem like a bank vs bank, Cabernet vs Merlot sort of year. Rather it seems like a year in which terroir was important, and the quality of work and decisions were critical. I had hoped for more from Graves than I saw, but I couldn't tell you why that is. Otherwise I saw exceptional examples everywhere (and disappointments). Perhaps it is not a memorable year for whites, though there were some very good ones (Pape Clement, Chevalier, and Pavillon Blanc), and I think generally the style of the (well-made) Sauternes is in the fuller style we actually go for less these days (bolder, heavier).

MY USUAL CAVEATS

In an ideal world I would taste from a wider range of châteaux, re-taste key wines on different days, and spend 3-4 weeks at this. My notes were made over a single week, brilliantly choreographed and hosted by my friend and négocient, Manu, and this report is the result of that very intense week. (Unfortunately, I had to miss some appointments this year).

I have been tasting en primeur for a number of years, and that affords a sort of 'tasting calibration' that can take into account the tender age of the wines. Wines that are only a few months old can be very tricky to judge, and score ranges and impressions – from anyone – should be treated as a rough guide to what we might expect in bottle. Some are almost opaque – if not in colour, in what they reveal about themselves at this embryonic stage. If I find a wine hard to judge I try to express that in the note, and give a wider score range too.

Wines also 'move around' a lot at this stage of their life. A week or two can make a big difference, but also tasting a cool sample on a wet cool morning at a UGC (or other group) tasting on one day, and a fairly warm sample, on a hot stuffy afternoon in a warm château salon on another can make a big difference (note, unfortunately, Châteaux d'Issan and Brane-Cantenac, suffered the latter – those wines may prove far better than the impressions they gave on the day, but I cannot write a note based on something imagined).

But I would therefore read more into a really positive tasting note and score than a negative one.

Style is as important a consideration as score. A high score doesn't mean you will like the wine, and a moderate score might be given to a very good one that is *right in the groove* of what you actually

enjoy. Read the descriptions carefully, and read from a variety of sources. (This is general advice when reading other people's tasting notes anyway).

Consider *prices* carefully when the offers come out. Most fine Bordeaux is nonetheless made in plentiful quantities, so it is not rare wine. We are fortunate to be living in a time when châteaux are making the best quality wines they have ever made, and we have had a number of recent successful vintages. When 2022s are released, look at other recent vintages for the same wines – read reviews, look at prices for those wines. Because you are buying 2022s as futures, they should look like a good deal today, compared to recent comparable quality vintages that are physically available for immediate delivery.

That said, it is my personal view that in today's market top quality Bordeaux offers very good value for money. Price is a question of market sentiment, but for quality in the bottle, I think there is amazing value available, especially in the tier right behind all the first growths (see my top values list for 2022 below).

I do think though that 2022 deserves a place in all Bordeaux enthusiasts' cellars. The natural sense of concentration and the freshness combine to offer a real vintage signature, one that Bordeaux enthusiasts will want to revisit. Amongst them are undoubtedly some future classics, and for value seekers there will be some exceptional gems to find too. Some '22s will find a place in my own cellar, for sure.

My top wines were all in the groove of the vintage - deeply-coloured, intense in fruit and aroma, but offering both freshness, and an elegant level of extraction that nonetheless feels like plenty. For Palmer (and Alter Ego), Lafite, La Conseillante, and Figeac, 2022 is amongst the best I have ever tasted from these properties - I would have no hesitation targeting these wines. Cheval Blanc reminds me of their seductive 1964 in 2022. To my palate, Angelus (95-97) (and Carillon) are at last matching the quality of work invested here with a style that is lighter in touch, more elegant, while losing nothing in expression. Canon (95-97) confirms once more that it is knocking on the door of a slot at 1er Grand Cru Classé 'A'. whatever that means anymore (Cheval Blanc and Ausone were once the only two leading at IGCCA level, and both have quit, along with Angelus, who had only just 'arrived' there in 2012). Canon is not IGCCA in price, so it's one to consider in '22. Figeac's superb, appellation-topping 2022 confirms it deserves its rank in this premier league level. Graves proved more of a mixed bag than I imagined, with good wines, but few that rose to the vintage highlights level. Les Carmes Haut-Brion - with a freshening proportion of whole bunch fruit used during fermentation - seemed to be the vintage winner in Graves - it's a really great

Carmes, and their "C" (92-94), made the same sort of way, was also a real success. Pape-Clément (94-96), who also seem to be taking their foot off the accelerator pedal lately, made one of the best Magrez-era wines I can recall in 2022. Pichon Baron rivals Latour in Pauillac in 2022. I missed the chance to taste it at the château, only sampling it at the UGC tasting, so perhaps its better still - but given it's price position, it's an easy choice in 2022. VCC, Trotanoy, Latour and Margaux all made my top ten, are all top class, but these properties have achieved even more stellar results in some recent vintages, so back-buying is an alternative strategy to consider here once we have seen prices (except Latour, who won't release theirs for several years anyway!).

Don't read too much into omissions in my report – especially this year. There are some key properties I missed visiting, unfortunately. On the primeurs circuit bumping into wine colleagues, I heard very good things about Montrose, Troplong-Mondot, and Rauzan-Ségla, amongst others.

Also note that because we are 'ambassadors' for the Guinaudeau family wines (including Lafleur), as well as Calicem/Couvent des Jacobins, I have withheld my ratings for this wines.*

If value is what you seek in 2022, I would read critics' reports widely to 'triangulate' reviews and look for value, because I tasted a number of wines that outperformed château rank and reputation in 2022. But, because the vintage had the potential to deliver excess – too much tannin, too much alcohol, yielding dry, hot hard wines – this isn't a year in which we can buy blindly. Canon tops my list this year because while it is not exactly inexpensive, I think it is now knocking on the door or IGCCA status, and it's price is well below that tier. I missed the chance to taste Grand Puy Lacoste at the château, yet even at the UGC tasting it seems it may be one of the best wines

they have ever made. An easy pick. I really liked Clerc Milon, Pavie Macquin, and at a number of estates where the grand vin had been made right, the 'second wine' seemed especially good, particularly in cases where they have their own dedicated plots, (rather than being a label for every form of demotion) - Alter Ego de Palmer and C de Carmes Haut-Brion spring to mind. But it was at the J-P Moueix stable tasting in Libourne that I really got the sense that 2022 will be a good vintage to treasure hunt. Bourgneuf may prove even better than my rating, it's a super Pomerol in 2022, yet it is one that is often overlooked. And Peymouton anyone? I imagine there a lot of examples in 2022 that punch well above their status weight. That said, again, 2022 is not a universal vintage, and there are some estates that delivered the year's worst traits - hard, hot, unbalanced wines. So, if you are value-seeking, read widely on the vintage, and you will find things that show the best side of the vintage at modest prices.

THE DRY WHITES (All Districts)

2022 Aile d'Argent (a white of Château Mouton-Rothschild, Pauillac)

90-92

At Château Clerc Milon, 27 April 2023

Light straw; sweet tropical fruit aroma, some freshness, oak spice; sweet round attack, rich, spicy, then tropical fruit flavour, some zestiness, classic Aile d'Argent style, round, gourmand, with good juiciness.

2022 Château Carbonnieux Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

90-92

At the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Pale straw; ripe musk melon and a touch of banana on the nose; juicy, ripe, yellow banana, good juicy acidity, round, with some green melon, some zest, a round mouthfeel, then there's an appetizing tangy twist on the finish. Good.

2022 Champs Libres (Mouillac)

Mouillac. 1.2ha on clay-limestone. 75% new oak. 100% Sauvignon Blanc, 24 Aug. Tasted at Château Lafleur, 28 April 2023

Bright light green gold; fresh, a more floral and lifted fragrance than the Grand Village Blanc; creamy and concentrated on the palate, intense fruit, fine spicy oak notes, a nice lip-smacking tanginess at the end with a little patisserie feel at the end from the barrel and lees. A gourmand Champs Libres. (Score withheld, The Fine Wine Experience is an 'ambassador' for Château Lafleur).

Château Les Charmes-Godard Blanc (Francs-Côtes de Bordeaux)

86-88

Primarily limestone-clay soils with some loamy soils over marl subsoil. 60% Semillon, 26-30 Aug; 27% Sauvignon Blanc, 29 Aug, 13% Sauvignon Gris, 1 Sept.

Tasted at Château Larcis-Ducasse, 25 April 2023 (Collection here in 14.5~14.7% ABV range)

Pale gold; fresh grapey fruit, pip fruit, and a light touch of fresh cut pineapple; juicy, a little more creamy, and naturally ripe, some honeyed notes – barley sugar perhaps, speak of the drought and summer, but stays quite fresh. Nice.

2022 Domaine de Chevalier Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

93-96

Tasted at Domaine de Chevalier, 26 April 2023

Bright light gold; really fresh, exuberant ripe aroma, full of fragrance, musk, fresh passionfruit, Alphonse mango, as well as a grassy coolness; the palate is lush, super energetic and zippy, it bounces along the palate depositing rich oozing fruit along the way, the acids are very present yet very ripe too, there is real phenolic complexity, the oak influencing only the texture which feels well buffed, polished, but there is no sense of oak flavour sitting outside of that. This is a really promising edition of Domaine de Chevalier Blanc in a gourmand groove.

2022 Château Couhins Lurton Blanc

86-89

Tasted at Château Couhins-Lurton, 26 April 2023

Light straw; fresh, grassy, cheesy nose; a round lush feel on the plate, with melon, gooseberry, lemon drop, grasses on the palate, this is both rounded and sharp, with a note of capsicum, but it is not aggressive in that Marlborough high-crop sort of way, there is some concentration. This has a nice chalky texture, there some lactic tone. Good.

2022 Château de Fieuzal Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

90-92

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Pale green gold; musk, grasses, and soft candy – marshmallow – on the nose; good concentration and admirable focus, the acidity and fine phenolics pull this ripe white in fairly tight, juicy musky fruit. This works well. Harmonious.

2022 Château Grand Village Blanc (Mouillac)

1.8ha of clay-limestone soil, 50% new barrels, 50% single use. 70% Sauvignon Blanc, 23, 24, 25 Aug.; 30% Sémillon, 23 Aug. Tasted at Château Lafleur, 28 April 2023

Pale and bright; lovely nose of green melon, zest, and a touch of spice, a little yellow banana in cream too; the palate is reassuringly juicy, creamy, rounded by the mid-palate, this has impressive intensity and fine phenolics. A Grand Village of intensity, generosity and roundness – the key to its intensity being the tiny berries: yields were lower than in 2021 even.

2022 Château Haut-Brion Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

Tasted at Château La Mission Haut-Brion, 26 April 2023

Light gold; both sweet fruit and a savoury musky tone on the nose, a bit sullen for HBB; juicy and bright, there is more energy here than in the LMHBB, but also a hard edge to the acidity. It doesn't feel green, but it doesn't feel especially ripe either – it is a blocky hard acidity I don't normally find in HBB. There is not the complexity or aroma on the nose or palate for HBB at *grand vin* level, it tastes ordinary. Perhaps I have caught it at a poor moment?

2022 La Clarté

(Graves. 2nd white wine of Châteaux Haut-Brion and La Mission Haut-Brion)

86-88

Tasted at Château La Mission Haut-Brion, 26 April 2023

Bright pale straw; pungeant. A ripe, grassy, musky nose, some savoury lactic tone and some SO2; quite a full and ponderous feel on the palate, both some tropical fruit flavours and some juicy almost green notes that don't yet quite feel knit. It may need a year or two to come together, but it feels like a shorter-lived Clarté in any case.

2022 Château Latour Martillac Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

Pale green gold; low key nose; full and juicy-creamy, real zestiness, grassy notes, and a juicy-intense melting finish. Good energy and harmony here.

2022 Château La Louvière Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

Tasted at Château Couhins-Lurton, 26 April 2023

Bright pale gold; blackcurrant spectrum sauvignon, with some kumquat; palate-coating, with fine grip, this has fruit reserve, and energy, it is juicy, blackcurrant, musk, and cool leaf notes in a rich package. Works well. Will need a couple of years to come into drinking, and then should keep well. Harmonious.

2022 Château La Mission Haut-Brion Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

Tasted at Château La Mission Haut-Brion, 26 April 2023

Pale green gold; a fine, apple, and melon aroma; a bold, rich feel, juicy gooseberry, and grasses, there is an incongruous feeling of both full fat glycerin and alcohol-laden fruit and also a juicy slightly tart acidity round the sides of the palate that denote a hint of greenness. There's attractive fragrance on the nose and palate, but the wine feels distinctly awkward and weighty today. Well made, but it feels like it was plucked from within difficult conditions. Perhaps it is a poor moment to taste this this morning?

2022 Château Olivier Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright green tone; fresh and grassy nose; tight and juicy, there is a prickle and an edge to the acidity, a little crunchy-capsicumy, this will possibly settle down well but it lacks the flow and harmony of some neighbours' wines.

2022 Clementin de Pape Clément Blanc (the 2nd white wine of Château Pape-Clement)

Tasted at Château Pape-Clement, 27th April 2022

Bright pale gold; lovely aroma of orange zest, tropical; flowers, and a little note of musk, its an appealing clear fresh aroma; full on the palate, well-shaped, with beautiful zesty fleshy fruit, a ripe piquancy and energy that flow through to a fairly long fragrant finish. Whatever oak is there buffing the edges and adding to a sense of mid-palate creaminess is well integrated and disappears on the finish. A wine of precision and class. A real success.

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Fresh and grassy, not as aromatic as at the chateau; ripe and full on the palate, citrus, more closed though than the château sample, and a bit harder in the phenolics than it tasted earlier at the château.

2022 Pavillon Blanc (a white of Château Margaux)

100% Sauvignon Blanc, harvest began 18 Aug. Just 14hl/ha – only 8000 bottles this year. 50% of the white grape harvest used in this label in 2022. Indeed, we were told that there will from this vintage on be a second tier label wine declassified from the white grand vin Pavillon Blanc. There will be no bought fruit for that, and they anticipate a 50/50 split between the two labels. The second wine won't be offered through the primeur system.

Tasted at Château Margaux, 27 April 2023

Pale green gold; fine, fragrant, fresh, almost cool and verdant surprisingly, it has an inviting refreshing aroma; juicy, lush and vibrant, zingy and energetic, there is also a fine creamy base to the texture. Really sapid and juicy and morish, great harmony and integration to this. Long finish. Really balanced.

2022 Château Puygueraud Blanc (Francs - Côtes de Bordeaux)

Limestone-clay on clay, with mark and asteriated rock subsoil. 86% Sauvignon Blanc, 24-26 Aug; 14% Sauvignon Gris, 31 Aug Tasted at Château Larcis-Ducasse, 25 April 2023 (Collection here in 14.5~14.7% ABV range)

Bright pale green gold; vibrant, grassy, with a lactic note; fresh, tight, a bit juicy/abrupt, it stops short on the finish. Clean, ok.

2022 Château Smith Haut Lafitte Blanc (Pessac-Léognan)

90% Sauvignon Blanc, 5% Sémillon, 5% Sauvignon Gris, 18 Aug – 2 Sept. 24hl/ha. Tasted at Château Smith Haut Lafitte, 26 April 2023

Bright light gold; a lovely fresh nose, more subdued than the second wine, with musk green melon, a touch of cream and spice; grand vin feel here on the palate – there is more density and intensity in the attack, it melts through the middle juicily, with zest, pear, and melon notes. There is some heft and it is felt as the finish rounds out smoothly. Indeed smooth is the key word here – it comes in with a big attack and then smooths out to a creamy quieter finish, like a sea plane landing. It's a grander wine than, say '17, and though it lacks the extreme multidimensionality or real snap of that wine, it nonetheless is a superb interpretation of the 2022 vintage and a grand SHL, well made.

2022 Les Hauts de Smith Blanc

(the 2nd wine of Château Smith Haut Lafitte Blanc)

Bright pale gold; a really floral-fresh bouquet, that burst from the glass, really joyous sort of aroma like walking into a room full of cut flowers, some fresh apple, pear and tropical fruit too, but nothing that feels heavy about it; the palate is juicy and round, sumptuous, there is something a little exotic, something a little luxurious, but principally this is fresh and expressive. A delicious wine. There is also a lip-smacking gently phenolic grip to it, lovely aicidy. A really good wine. Alcohol is there, but in balance.

2022 Château Grand Village Rouge (Mouillac)

10ha on clay-limestone. 30% new oak. 80% Merlot, 9, 10, 15, 16 Sept.; 20% Bouchet, 22, 23 Sept. Tasted at Château Lafleur, 28 April 2023

Deep crimson glass-staining ruby; a lush, ripe dark fruit nose, reserved and brooding; a lush, sweet rich palate, juicy-creamy, seamless, melting like dark berry sherbet on the palate, ripe velvety tannins. This is a ripe, opulent, juicy-fresh Grand Village.

Semi-clear deep ruby; ripe, fresh and sweet, and spicy in aroma, a cool fresh breezy note like seaside air really lifts it; really lovely on the palate, concentrated yet effortless in feel, palate-coating, sweet and fresh with a salty note that adds to its morishness, this cuddles the palate generously and gently, with a long very fruity extension that follows the finish. This is a super Bourgneuf!

2022 Château Certan de May

Clay and deep gravel. 60% Merlot, 7 Sept; 30% Cabernet Franc, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20 Sept. Tasted at Ets. Jean-Pierre Moueix, Libourne, 28 April 2023

A deeper shade of ruby-crimson, semi-opaque; very sweet, kirsch-like aroma, super intense and potent, yet bursting and energetic, and very pure at the same time; sweet essency fruit on the palate, very intense, with some fine crème de cassis, fresh ripe black cherry juice, the profile here is dark, brooding, sunny and vibrant, alive and energetic. It is a bold wine, liqueur-rich almost, yet it stays moderate in its alcohol-feel, the tannins are velvety, with a mineral edge. It is very ripe, it skirts the edge of overripeness without going over. An exotic twist to the finish.

2022 Château Chantalouette (2nd wine of Château de Sales)

Semi-clear ruby; a sweet fresh-fruited and spicy nose, more cooked fruits spectrum; sweet, fresh, moderate in weight on the palate, juicy, very digestible, lively, with lovely fruit, a cool leafy note in the mix. Delicious.

2022 Château La Conseillante

87% Merlot, 5-13 Sept; 13% Cabernet Franc, 13 & 20 Sept. 14% ABV. 3.65PH. Tasted at Château La Conseillante, 25 April 2023

Semi-clear deep ruby; a gorgeous, scented nose, ripe fruit, perfume, florals; fleshy, yet well-trimmed, well-shaped, there is a sense of fine delicate yet distinct structure from the melting tannins. A lovely bittersweet quality, freshness, intensity, and balance. There's also a super mid-palate intensity, and really long finish. The alcohol is present, but not distracting, it remains balanced, and with a real sense of harmony and integration. 2022 Château Hosanna

This is undoubtedly superb, but does it join the pantheon of recent greats from VCC? Perhaps I will be proven conservative with this one.

Fine ruby, fresh rim; lovely open, spicy, floral aroma, enticing; fine, silky, red and dark fruit, elegant wine, midconc, there is an appetizing scale and freshness to this, it invites another sip. This has the most délicatesse so far on the Right Bank. Really lovely, morish - in spite of the high alcohol level.

St.-Emilion Grand Cru. Second wine of Château Ausone, from the same terroir – asteria limestone plateau and calcerous clay slope. 60% Cabernet Franc, 21 & 27 Sept; 35% Merlot, 5 & 9 Sept; 5% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30 Sept. 15% ABV. Tasted at Château Ausone, 25 April 2023.

Semi-opaque crimson; a really lovely nose, floral, and fresh and expressive; rich, flowing, some heat, but there is also freshness and there is a fluidity to this which gives it some charm. Powdery-fine tannin. Finishes hot.

2022 Château Bélair-Monange

St.-Emilion 1er Grand Cru Classé. Asteriated limestone on the plateau, blue clay on limestone on the slopes. 98% Merlot, 2% Cabernet France, 8-20 Sept.

Tasted at Ets. Jean-Pierre Moueix, Libourne, 28 April 2023

Semi-clear deep ruby; a fine nose, a touch exotic, fresh, quite mineral, detailed; fine on the palate, ripe with a clear, firm structure, melting fruit, some alcohol evident – there is a little heat here, some brûlée tone to the ripe fruit, initially I felt it lacked a little lift or sparkle, but, thinking I might have palate fatigue, I had a glass of water, a rest, and came back to it... this is melting, finely structured, with its minerality evident, melting fruit. But my question mark for Bélair-Monange this year is whether the more typically chiseled and airy feel I usually really love in these terroirs will come through and 'lift' it a little more in bottle. It feels like it may be too much in the direction of heaviness in 2022, but let's see in bottle.

Semi-clear full crimson ruby; spicy brooding nose; lush, fleshy, spicy, some alcohol warmth, but a nice freshness too, ripe and full, but very supple and melting. Very good. Freshness and lift on the finish.

St.-Emilion Grand Cru Classé. 65% Merlot, 29 Aug – 5 Sept; 35% Cabernet Franc, 14 Sept. 45hl/ha. 14.5% ABV. Tasted at Château Canon, 25 April 2023

Full ruby; sweet spicy exuberant fruit, more bass notes to Canon's more fresh/mineral treble; ripe, lush, a very friendly style, with lovely purity of fruit, spices, balance, this is a delicious wine. A super Berliquet in a big-scale expression, but it is well composed. The 2022 says "pay attention to Berliquet, it's not only risen, it's arrived."

2022 Calicem ---

100% Merlot. 14.7% ABV.

Tasted at Calicem, 25 April 2023

Semi-opaque deep ruby; reserved nose at first; sweet, warm, supple, bold, opulent at first, with air a fresh creaminess emerges, bright raspberry fruit expression, juicy and lush, supple, melting with a bittersweet twist at the end, it is fresh-ripe, luscious, creamy and long.

Long melting chocolate and dark fruit finish. Superb.

There is a salty sort of mineral feel to the fine tannins. Clarity of fruit expression. The structure is there, very fine like a delicate fine exoskeleton, it flows across the palate with the juicy ripe fruit without clogging the finish. Indeed it takes several sips to perceive the tannins building on the palate. A fine wine of real harmony and class.

2022 "C" des Carmes Haut-Brion

Deep semi-opaque garnet, pink rim; sweet fragrant cooked black plums, a floral edge, nice freshness; really sweet on the palate, but also quite tangy, with notes of licorice, dark plum, there is some lift and verve in this. Velvety tannin. Real freshness, some salinity, it feels really balanced (and is 'just' 13.5% ABV), long and fragrant. A standout success. Opulent for sure, but balanced. Floral finish. Fresh deep ruby, semi-clear; fresh, with a more blue flowers dimension, fine ripe dark fruit, pure in expression; sumptuous in feel, warm in tone, generous and sunny, formidable yet fine ripe tannins settle forward in the palate, masking the length, there lacks a kick of freshness at the finish to return the florals from the aroma, but there is some succulence still. It is liquoriously rich, with dense 2005-like tannins, though more precise, yet sweeter, larger than that. Despite an opulence of fruit, it feels like a real vin de garde – somewhere between 2009 and 2005. It is hard to judge the trajectory of this vintage.

2022 Haut Baily II

65% Merlot 30% Cabernet Sauvignon, 3% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot, 7-27 Sept. Tasted at Château Haut Bailly, 26 April 2023

Fresh deep ruby, semi-clear; a fresh and floral-led ripe fruit aroma, red and dark fruit; supple, plump, sweet dark cherry and plum fruit, meltingly sweet and rich, yet with nice acidity, it is pure, like a dark cherry liqueur with dark chocolate melting in the mouth. Cherry cake. Succulent, with a warm finish, it is a very sweet though not 'burnt' wine.

2022 Château Haut-Brion

Tasted at Château La Mission Haut-Brion, 26 April 2023

Deep semi-opaque ruby; there's an exquisite sweetness of fruit and floral perfume emanating from this in a quiet, reserved way, a really very fine nose; supple, elegant, there is fine structure, and ripe opulent fruit, the richness of fruit is aligned to some alcohol weight in feel, there is a slight burn on the finish that is not there with the Mission. Dry extract levels feel really high, on the right side of the line between ripeness and overripeness, but still there is a pull in that direction that leaves me feeling grounded, rather than elevated, it doesn't give that elegant feeling of lift off, or sublime elegance. The tannins too have a very slight edge, though that is perhaps exacerbated by their concentration, and the note of alcohol. Though the aroma and palate fragrance are really appealing, the tannins are quite formidable, and there is some burn from the alcohol. It will take long cellaring to sort this out I think. It will come out of dormancy earlier than LMHB. Will it be pretty? There is quite some feeling of alcohol here, so I have a question mark over it for now.

2022 Le Clarence de Haut-Brion

Tasted at Château La Mission Haut-Brion, 26 April 2023

Semi-clear full ruby; a fresh fruit aroma with a real sweetness of beautifully ripe fruit, some florals, and detail, sweet cherry; succulent fruit, there is a lovely scented dark cherry tone to the fruit, there is more structure evident to this than the Chapelle, quite some substance and weight, but it is still elegant and fresh, with a long finish. There is quite some tannin, and I feel this Clarence will need more cellaring than some, to find its window. It is also a bit hot on the finish, a little spirity. Well made, but I feel the hot-dryness of the vintage clearly here.

2022 Château Latour Martillac

86-88

Tasted at UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Semi-clear crimson; sweet fruit, spice, leather on the nose; a juicy attack, plummy, some freshness, chocolate, slightly edgy tannins, a little dryness in the tannins. Warm finish.

2022 Château La Louvière Rouge

Tasted at Château Couhins-Lurton, 26 April 2023

89-91

Fresh ruby colour; bright ripe dark cherry, a little on-the-cusp to over-ripe; a sweet, ripe, juicy fruit, very intense, wound-up, and with very good acidity. Really distinct black cherry taste. Potent, some alcohol, but loads of very good fruit, fairly velvety texture.

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Clear mid ruby; beautiful, sweet fresh fruit, floral and attractive nose; really lovely fruit, melting extract, supple tannins, this is rich but fresh, lively and well balanced. One of the best if not the best LCMHB I can recall. Real purity and clarity of fresh expression. Really lovely wine. Ripe, a touch of fudge in the second tasting of this, but there is sufficient energy. I think it works well. For me this is the most interesting wine in the Clarence Dillon flight for 2022, as quality and price should align well.

2022 Château Olivier Rouge

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Deep ruby-crimson, crimson rim; an attractively fresh aroma, fine ripe fresh plummy fruit, some fine herb notes, this is an attractive inviting aroma; juicy-ripe, palate coating, with lots of delicious fruity extract, supple fairly light tannins, it feels sumptuous and flowing, with good energy. There is a little warmth on the finish, but there is also nice fruitiness.

2022 Château Pape Clement

Tasted at Château Pape Clément, 26 April 2023

Full, semi-opaque ruby; ripe fresh dark fruit aroma; ripe succulent fruit, immaculate quality, full, balanced with plenty of zing, powdery fine tannin, it fills the mouth with fragrance. This is superb. The alcohol presence is there but fully in check, this feels both concentrated and moderate in expression, very fine quality.

2022 Château Smith Haut Lafitte Rouge

64% Cabernet Sauvignon, 32% Merlot, 3% Cabernet Franc, 1% Petit Verdot, 5-30 Sept, 29hl/ha. Tasted at Château Smith Haut Lafitte, 26 April 2023

Deep semi-opaque dark ruby; fresh ripe nose, new leather notes, it seems very dense from the aroma; ripe, intense, very thick in the palate, a lot of extract and what feels like a very low skins/solids to juice ratio, it is positively pulpy-thick, but juicy, and the tannins are very rounded and velvety. Iron first in a velvet glove, this is very long term, but it feels like it has the equilibrium required – there is oodles of fruit, and adequate freshness and the alcohol feels balanced too.

Margaux 2ème Cru Classé. 74% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8-29 Sept; 23% Merlot, 7-16 Sept; 1% Cabernet Franc, 26 Sept, 4 Oct; 1% Petit Verdot, 22-29 Sept; 1% Carmenère, 10 Oct. 14.3% ABV. 15.8% press wine. 3.61PH. Proprietor Henri Lurton believes "this is my greatest vintage". It was his 30th vintage, and he feels it is 'legendary, like 1945 and 1961', and he dedicates his 2022 to his late father, Lucien Lurton (1925-2023). Speaking with Henri at the château, he noted that in 2022 he used the highest proportion of press wine (15.8%) ever used in the grand vin because every time there was more of it in the blind tastings of assembled components it offered more to the wines. I mention all of this in part as a note of caution over my tasting note and score – I didn't feel the wine showed so well. It was late on a very warm afternoon, and both the château, and the sample were also a little warm. It is therefore one of the 2022s I most wish to re-taste in bottle, to see why Henri's confidence and my experience on the day were this far apart.

Tasted at Château Brane-Cantenac, 27 April 2023

Ful ruby, semi-clear; ripe fragrant fruit and coffee-bean vanilla oak; good flesh, sweet fruit, a little chewy, not over-extracted, it's just a little candied in the style. Still, there is some elegance to this, but it feels a little dried, a little sec. Candied finish. This 2022 Brane-Cantenac sample is fleshy, it flows, but there is less of the freshness on show here than I anticipated, and there is an almost bitter (though not unripe) note to the tannin, and a candied note to the fruit. A truly perplexing sample.

2022 Baron de Brane

2nd wine of Château Brane-Cantenac. 65% Merlot, 7-16 Sept; 30% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8-29 Sept; 4% Cabernet Franc, 26 Sept, 4 Oct; 1% Petit Verdot, 22-29 Sept. 14% ABV. 13.4% press wine. 3.57 PH.

Tasted at Château Brane-Cantenac, 27 April 2023

Full deep ruby; some freshness, a spicy and slightly exotic fruit nose; sweet and lush, candied fruit, gently chewy, light tannins. Like a dark fruit hard candy, the finish blocks up with soft tannin and a lack of freshness or acidity. Will probably tire a bit early based on this sample. Unexpected.

2022 Blason de d'Issan

87-89?

Tasted at Château d'Issan, 27 April 2023

Semi-opaque crimson; fresh fruit on the nose, low key; attractive juicy dark fruit, nice flow, more elegant, plenty of extract, rich, there's some alcohol but it not too hot, it is tannic, but it has some flow. A firm warm wine. Is it just that the tasting sample is warm, and this château salon we are tasting in this afternoon is also? Hard to judge this.

2022 Château d'Issan

87-88?

Tasted at Château d'Issan, 27 April 2023

Opaque crimson; a fairly closed and leathery nose, some spices and florals; rich, concentrated, dense, quite warm in alcohol, oozing, essency, there is a lot of thick extract here, a lot of tannin to shed, this seems a big ungainly d'Issan, the freshness kick is not there to deal with it I fear. Is it just that the tasting sample is warm, and this château salon too? I envisaged something fresher than this.

2022 Château Margaux

96-98+

92% Cabernet Sauvignon, 6% Merlot, 2% Cabernet Franc. 8-27 Sept. 40% of the Château Margaux harvest. Tasted at Château Margaux, 27 April 2023

Fairly opaque crimson; beautifully fine, fresh violetty Cabernet nose, low key but perfumed; exquisite fruit, really essency level concentration, and laden with tannin, though they are super silky in quality and the wine has an effortless feel to it. Perfume retained on the palate. It's intense, but it has a relaxed feel, belying what must be one of the most packed Margaux ever, it feels really gently made. This feels like an even purer, finer re-ediiton of the '86, yet more floral, it has the '86's intense statuesque feel. Outstanding wine.

2022 Pavillon Rouge

Second wine of Cháteau Margaux. 64% Cabernet Sauvignon, 24% Merlot, 7% Petit Verdot, 5% Cabernet Franc. 8-27 Sept. 32% of the Château Margaux harvest.

Tasted at Château Margaux, 27 April 2023

Fine fairly opaque ruby; fresh summer pudding nose; intense, dense, luscious fruit, mouth-coating, grand vin feel, there is a slight edge to the tannins, but there is enormous extract, freshness, juiciness, it feels very dense. Very pure and fine expression. This is vin de garde. Good length. Very good.

2022 Château Palmer

98-100

Tasted at Château Palmer, 27 April 2023

Clear deep crimson ruby; beautiful aroma, a little exotic, very expressive, and fine, spicy, also really beguiling and alluring, floral, with an exotic edge to the fruit, and freshness; beautiful fruit, this rings like a bell, it is so harmonious, intense, there is amplitude yet density too, freshness, ripeness, concentration, and superb harmony. This is a joyous wine, lush, there is density for sure, vin de garde, but it is expressive, not locked down, and it is complex in its aromatic expression on the palate, it gives such confidence. Fabulous Palmer. Wine of the vintage?

2022 Alter Ego de Palmer

Tasted at Château Palmer, 27 April 2023

Deep ruby crimson; lush fresh berries, juicy squishy and fresh; beautiful lush juicy fruit, intense freshness and vibrancy, almost crunchy, yet ripe and rich, lovely harmony and intensity. This is a gorgeous Alter Ego. Long, with density of fruity, super fine silky tannins, flowing and delicious. A superb Alter Ego. My rating may prove conservative.

2022 Clos du Marquis

45.5% Merlot, 44.5% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc.

Tasted at Château Nenin, 25 April 2023

Fresh dense crimson with bright narrow crimson rim; a really fresh clear aroma, juicy, floral and vibrant in expression; ripe, rich, lush, with a melting texture, bold, the boldness offset by a sense of floral freshness, melting palate-coating extract that melts away (holding plenty of ripe tannin). The alcohol note will remain noticeable, but there is not much else to say against this for quality or expression.

2022 Château Ducru-Beaucaillou

Tasted at Château Ducru Beaucaillou, 27 April 2023

Deep crimson, semi-opaque; fresh, a little closed, some new leather, brooding nose, some vanilla, touch coffee; really formidable, its is packed with fruit and extract, but it is almost completely totally shut today. Swingingly tannic. It is hard to judge. It's an absolutely formidable Ducru. A monster Ducru! But not in alcohol – which is not that high relatively (14%). This is an implosion, a black hole. You will disappear and not come out! Let's see what it does in the cellar. I'll rate it when its in bottle. It could be amazing. Or it may leave no witnesses. We shall have to see.

2022 La Croix Ducru-Beaucaillou

66% Merlot, 32% Cabernet Sauvignon, 2% Petit Verdot Tasted at Château Ducru Beaucaillou, 27 April 2023

Deep crimson; ripe, opulent and fresh aroma; sweet fruit, juicy, lush and flowing, this is laden with sweet juicy fruit, nice balance to this. Touch of espresso in the finish. It is quite structured, there is classic extraction, it's not over the top but you really feel the tannin.

2022 Le Petit Ducru

Tasted at Château Ducru Beaucaillou, 27 April 2023

Full crimson, semi-clear; fresh, ripe, some florals; lush, ripe, then quite tannic, the grip is quite firm, there is some alcohol, some opulence, it dries out a bit. A lot of tannin to shed.

2022 Madame de Beaucaillou

Tasted at Château Ducru Beaucaillou, 27 April 2023

Fine deep ruby garnet; fresh, sweet nose; bright juicy, quite tight, sweet, melting, chunky. Quite concentrated and tannic though sweetly so. Opulent, with structure.

2022 Château Langoa-Barton

Tasted at Château Langoa-Barton, 27 April 2023

Semi-opaque crimson; fresh berry compote, some oak-vanilla tone overlaying this like a gentle veil; concentrated Langoa, dark fruit, quite a bit of classic oak-vanilla creaminess, it feels like it will harmonise well. Well balanced with nice acidity, Solid.

2022 Château Léoville Barton

Tasted at Château Langoa-Barton, 27 April 2023

Opaque, crimson; fresh, a little more floral and detailed than the Langoa, less cloaked; rich in extract and fruit, with a slightly furry old school frame of very ripe sweet tannins, it stays juicy and lively and fresh. Very very good.

2022 Château Léoville Las Cases

83.5% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10.5% Cabernet Franc, 6% Merlot.

Tasted at Château Nenin, 25 April 2023

Opaque crimson, narrow crimson rim; a reserved nose, floral, fresh, with licorice-edged fruit; dense, compact, unyielding really, though the texture is powdery, and glycerin-rich and melting. A real vin de garde – boof! My goodness, this is a formidable wine. Essency in its intensity. Feels like it is in balance, it's just that it is very wrapped up tight. Embryonic in fact. Where to rate this? It's very tricky because it's so tightly wound today, but it feels like it could become one of the greats – it has that much within it. It may turn out like the '45 or the '86, though possibly more supple than either of those. Be warned however, I imagine the likely drinking window beginning after 20 years, with an easy half century of life, and possibly a whole one. It will be interesting to track. The brave and the young should give it a go.

Semi-clear deep ruby; a brooding ripe dark fruit aroma, low key; dark fruit, good juicy freshness, some density, it is a little more hunkered and weighty in feel compared to Clerc Milon, but there is a lot of fruit, juiciness, and ripe tannins. There's quite some depth and structure here. A keeper d'Armailhac. Very good.

2022 Château Clerc Milon

Semi-opaque crimson; ripe, pure aroma, fresh, very clean and precise blackcurrant and fresh forest berry aroma; luscious, melting intensity, lovely fresh vibrancy, silky-fine fine tannins, an almost dark berry sherbet-like melting quality there is such alignment between intense berry, sorbet juicy sweetness, and fine powdery tannin. Very good length. Great Clerc Milon.

2022 Pastourelle de Clerc Milon

Full crimson, semi-opaque; sweet fresh fruit, classic, touch blackcurrant leaf; attractive juicy blackcurranty fruit, soft tannin, fruity, and with a really attractive classic blackcurrant and blackcurrant leaf aromatic taste, fine powdery tannins, and good length. Very good quality for second wine.

2022 Château Duhart-Milon

Tasted at Château Lafite-Rothschild, 27 April 2023

Deep semi-opaque ruby; a fairly closed nose, some leather; delicious fleshy dark berry fruit, there's nice freshness here, a bit of dryness in the tannin – a seedsy note that feels a bit dry, but doesn't stop the flow of fruit. And the fruit is lovely – aromatic, fresh, and bursting with vitality. I just wonder if the tannins will retain a dry note. Good.

2022 Château Grand Puy Lacoste

Tasted at the UGC Pauillac Tasting, Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Fairly opaque deep crimson ruby; lovely sweet ripe fruit, good freshness; lush, thick, perfumed, sweet, and lovely in expression, a little oak gloss, but it marries well and the texture is good, thick, and flowing. Really very good. Superb GPL. A clear success in 2022.

2022 Château Haut Batailley

Tasted at Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Deep semi-opaque ruby crimson; a sweeter nose than the Verso, forest berries and fresh apple; succulent, super concentrated, so juicy, vibrant, with super velvet tannins, this is very intense, well-balanced, vin de garde, but there is nothing 'blocked' about it, there's very good flow and balance

Tasted at Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Full deep ruby; a really particularly nose of baked rhubarb and sweet red fruits, its really quite a nose, appetizing but unexpected, atypical; absolutely delicious melting succulence, just gorgeous fruit, the texture and elegant closer to lush Pinot Noir the feeling is so tender, the extract is really something it is so fruity and vibrant and fresh. This is so yummy! Gosh, I hope this retains all this excitement after bottling. You can tuck into this early as one hell of a picnic wine! I have nothing bad to say for it.

2022 Moulin de Duhart

Tasted at Château Lafite-Rothschild, 27 April 2023

Semi-clear deep ruby; sweet berry fruit and a touch of milk coffee; lush, fresh, nice full juicy fruit in the attack, there is a lactic note – vanilla-toned, following the nose, tannic extraction is light although there is a hint of dryness in the texture, but it is slight. There's good length. Nice wine.

2022 Château Lafite-Rothschild

Tasted at Château Lafite-Rothschild, 27 April 2023

Semi-opaque deep crimson ruby; a fine, detailed, aromatically reserved but complex nose very Lafite, fresh, elegant; gorgeous fruit, juicy, lush yet lively, fresh, and there is layering here, a fine tannic structure that doesn't show any of the dryness evident in the other three wines. It is so juicy and lively, yet really concentrated and intense. This gives a real sense of confidence – the equilibrium is there, that little vibration when everything is in an effortless feeling of harmony. Super long. Superb. There's lots of minerality, and a salty edge. It's all here – this is the complete Lafite, no question.

The tannins may tip this just out of balance – a hint of dryness – but the fruit and freshness are lovely, and I think this will come good. It will need some cellaring. High quality Carruades.

It's a clearly very long term wine, beautifully made, well balanced. Superb. Turns floral and deliciously sweet and a touch exotic than when first poured.

2022 Les Forts de Latour

58.7% Cabernet Sauvignon, 37.9% Merlot, 3.4% Petit Verdot. 14.47% ABV. 80 IPT. 4.2% press wine. 40.8% of the production. Tasted at Château Latour, 27 April 2023

Deep crimson, glass-staining; fresh fruit, some florals, touch leather; sweet fresh fruit, really compact feel, like a 2001 Space Odyssey 'monolith' mid-palate shape, the lush fruit running either side of this monolithic textural shape, and to the front and back of the palate, its so juicy, yet there is quite some extract and tannin to shed. I'm confident – its ripe, but it will need time.

2022 Pauillac de Château Latour

2022 Château Lynch Bages

Tasted at Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Opaque crimson, narrow rim, glass-staining; quite closed, clean, but not expressing much; formidable Lynch Bages, dense, thick, quite oaky – there's both the texture and a vanilla tone given off by the oak here that sits out today. This is a dense Lynch Bages, full of ripe extract, there's good balanced acidity and freshness, and the intense level of tannin stays supple, but this is for sure dense, and the oak component is a forceful element. It's in the classic LB style, so will probably work out with cellaring, but I just wonder if it is over-marked by the oak. Lynch Bages often pulls it off with cellaring so let's see.

2022 Echo de Lynch Bages

Tasted at Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Fairly opaque crimson; sweet fruit, some spice, licorice; dense, ripe, juicy, intense extract of juicy dark fruit, some oak-furriness here, it turns a little solid on the finish, but it is packed with fruit, and a bit more cellaring than usual should take care of it.

2022 Château Mouton-Rothschild

Tasted at Château Clerc Milon, 27 April 2023

Deep fairly opaque crimson; rich, ripe, spicy and brooding aroma, very grand vin Mouton, exuberant; ripe, grand, concentrated, fleshy, this feels like a really built Mouton, a Mouton with a solid formidable chassis, and loads of fruit to unpack on top of it. The fruit feels perfectly ripe, concentrated, and it all melts away by the finish leaving fragrant length. It's a dense year Mouton, it doesn't bounce along, nor does it leave a multi-layered 'extra' something in the fragrance, but there is very good quality fruit, a low solids-juice feel, the tannins are sweet, and there is some Dutch salted licorice at the finish. The fruit does not feel overmature – and there is no obtrusive alcohol or other imbalance issues evident. It is a sullen, moody Mouton that wants to be left alone, leaving me describing more what it isn't than what it is. I'm confident it will be very good, possibly great, but it doesn't sing that extra Mouton greatness to me in a way I can go ah-hah!

2022 Le Petit Mouton

2nd wine of Château Mouton-Rothschild Tasted at Château Clerc Milon, 27 April 2023

Semi-opaque deep ruby; sweet berry fruit and a savoury tone to the nose, leather, there is a touch of rubber, or even brunt rubber in the mix, but it is slight – nonetheless a nose that is not expressing so well today; much better on the palate, though the tannins are quite formidable, there's some dryness. The finish trails off leaving the impression of tannins – the palate beached somewhat on them. There's plenty in this wine, and perhaps it's just a bit awkward and angular. But I feel confident that Pastourelle de Clerc Milon – a really delightful surprise – is a more pleasurable second wine Pauillac in the offing than this Petit Mouton, which realty feels like the cutting room floor after the *grand vin* edit. I tasted it twice to check I wasn't just being mean, and while I found some energy here, it's also hot and a bit scratchy. Rustic, burly, well-stuffed, but the label will signal more than this delivers in 2022.

2022 Château Pedesclaux

Tasted at Château d'Issan, 27 April 2023

Deep crimson ruby; some aromatic detail but fairly closed on the nose, new leather; firm, tannic, but there is a juicy core, there is a lot of tannin to shed here however, it is swingingly mouth-dryingly tannic. Is it just that the tasting sample is warm, and so too this château salon we are tasting in this afternoon?

2022 Château Pichon Longueville Baron

Tasted at the UGC Pauillac Tasting, Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Fairly opaque dense crimson; lovely aromatic nose, really fresh, effortless ripe and quite floral, lifted freshness; extraordinary fruit extract, this zings along in spite of a richness with airy grace, rides like a Bentley Continental Turbo. It is so well-defined, so lively and pretty that you forget the sheer bulk in behind. This is a Pichon for the ages, yet the silky harmony makes it delicious even as a sample.

2022 Château Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande

Tasted at the UGC Pauillac Tasting, Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Opaque crimson; a spicy and exotic brooding nose; lush, sweet, dense, melting, this feels built, it doesn't have the soaring fresh energy of Baron, but there is rich full fruit, and a voluptuousness to it. Melting tannins like fine chocolate. Slows down a bit sweet and ponderous at the end.

Semi-opaque crimson; leathery, a touch peppery on the nose; tight and tannic, a hard frame, not showing much fruit, a touch peppery, stops hard and short. Swingingly tannic. A touch of warmth on the finish. Is it just that the tasting sample is warm, and so too this château salon we are tasting in this afternoon?

2022 Château Phélan Ségur

56% Merlot, 40% Cabernet Sauvignon, 2% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot. 14-26 Sept. 14.2% ABV. 3.8PH. 96 IPT. Tasted at Château Phélan Ségur, 27 April 2023

Dense, opaque, crimson; ripe, spicy, reserved nose; lush, rich, intense, macerated berries and plums, some vanilla oak, warm, opulent, tannins are fairly silky, the finish has alcohol evident and some vanilla toasted oak aroma within the fruit. This is packed with fruit, but it lacks the freshness we just saw in Pauillac and south. Nonetheless, it works, its full of fruit, the tannins are very supple.

2022 Frank Phélan 85-87

80% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon, 14-26 Sept. 14% ABV. 3.9PH. 85 IPT. Tasted at Château Phélan Ségur, 27 April 2023

Semi-opaque full ruby; sweet macerated berries, good freshness; lush, creamy, spicy fruit, a touch of heat and baked fruit. The tannins have some edge to them, and there is a hint of green – like 'blockage'. But there is some nice fruit.

2022 Château Les Ormes de Pez

Tasted at Château Lynch Bages, 27 April 2023

Semi-clear deep ruby; fresh, fragrant; juicy, lush and concentrated, a melting feel, vibrant, some spices, fine tannin, there is good energy to this. Lots of juicy fruity extract, its quite intense, a salty edge. Very good.

2022 Château Broustet

Tasted at he UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Light gold; vibrant and delicious aroma of fresh cut fruit salad; candied orange peel, pineapple, zest, and cream, fresh, balanced and long. Delicious.

2022 Château Climens

Tasted at he UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright light gold; a fine fresh complex nose; thick, warm, creamy, melting, phenolic texture at the base, this feels closed in, primordial, but there is an ample Climens shape. Hard to judge on this sample, but seems in the Climens groove. Just doesn't quite have the lift of some years.

2022 Château Coutet

2022 Château Doisy Daëne

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright gold; some volatile acidity, and a masked aroma of spicy fruit; very rich, unctuous, ponderous, sweet, plenty of banana and pineapple fruit, a little heavy and soft in its feel and taste.

2022 Château Doisy Vedrines

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright pale gold; bright, some VA, some botrytis leading the nose, there is brightness and freshness here too in the tone; sweet and melting, with an elegant line of Barsac elegance, it finish quite sweet, like a barely sugar, but with a satisfying level of complexity.

2022 Château de Fargues

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright gold; spicy, waxy complex fruit, rich with candied pear and pineapple; sweet, unctuous, really concentrated, this is grand Sauternes, mouth-filling, opulent, creamy and packed with melting candied fruits and spices. A wine to finish a Roman banquet adequately with.

2022 Château Guiraud

Tasted at Domaine de Chevalier, 26 April 2023

Bright yellow gold; ripe, spicy, tropical fruit and cooked ripe pears and apples, an enticing aroma; succulent, sweet, liquorious yet buoyant with a nice core of freshness, honeyed pears and nougat, lovely spicy elements, and soft unctuous finish.

2022 Clos Haut Peyraguey

93-95

Tasted at Château Pape Clément, 26 April 2023

Bright light gold; lovely pineapple pudding nose, pastry laden with butter, but it seems to be emanating from the fruit – the oak is so well integrated. This is soaring, spicy and exuberant on the nise; sweet, melting, coconut cream and pineapple, and if that combination sounds appealing, you'll love this – it's like a fresh Thai dessert in Thailand where it tastes exactly right. Long and creamy, and there is sufficient acidity to match the richness. Alcohol feels moderate, indeed this is all very harmonious, well controlled (no VA).

2022 Château Lafaurie Peyraguey

90-92

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Quite a full gold, almost old gold; a full nose, some VA lift, botrytis; oozingly rich, it oozes along the palate ponderously, seemingly continuing to melt through to its soft caramel and toffee fruit taste well after the finish. It feels north of 200g/I but that may be due to any lack of lift, or brightness in the picture. A nice choice when you want a sort of luxuriant melting toffee-caramel type of experience, it works well in that way, though some will find this same effect cloying.

2022 Château Rieussec

89-91

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright green gold; bright fresh candied vibrant fruit, nice aromatic clarity; unctuous, really sweet, there is also a spritiness here – some heat, which is unusual given the richness of extract and residual sugar. Hefty. The effect on the palate is not as good as on the nose.

2022 Château Suduiraut

93-95

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright gold; some VA lift, a big nose, crème patissière and the crust, grilled white peach; unctuous and concentrated, real depth and dimension, this is lusciously sweet large-scaled, but it is balanced and it flows well, with a long, spicy tail. Really satisfying in a more hedonistic guise of Suduiraut.

2022 Château La Tour Blanche

91-93

Tasted at the UGC Graves Tasting, Château Fieuzal, 26 April 2023

Bright light gold; a fresh, but still full of fermentation aromas, like a beer; sweet, candied pineapple, pear, quince, spices, full, classic, full but contained style Sauternes.
